Assessment Guidelines

CHALLENGE, ENCOURAGE, ACHIEVE

WELCOME TO YEAR 9 AND 10 THE RECORD OF SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT

To be eligible for a Record of School Achievement (RoSA), students must satisfy requirements, in terms of courses, course patterns, attendance, application, participation and school assessment. Students who wish to apply for a RoSA must see the Deputy Principal.

The Year 9 and 10 course of study will include the core subjects - English, Mathematics, Science, History and Geography. You must also have had adequate experience in PD/H/PE, and have completed your elective subjects. All subjects must be satisfactorily *completed* in order to be awarded a RoSA.

STAGE 5 GRADING SYSTEM OF THE RECORD OF SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT

All subjects studied for Year 10 will be awarded grades and these will be based on how well you have achieved in the course according to sets of Course Performance Descriptors prepared by NESA. The grades for these subjects are based on achievement as follows:

The school will allocate grades in all subjects on the basis of internal assessment and testing.

ASSESSMENT TASKS

In order to accurately assess you on the basis of Course Performance Descriptors, you will be required to complete assessment tasks in each course. These tasks are listed in this booklet. Assessment in a course will relate to the stated objectives and outcomes of the course. It can be formal or informal. Everyday class work is integral to the formulation of a course grade.

When you are issued a formal assessment task you will be given:

- written notification
- at least two weeks to complete.

You are responsible for:

- completing the task to the best of your ability
- handing the task in on the due date
- completing your own work
- managing time provided in class for assessment
- acknowledging all sources.

All tasks must be accompanied by a signed declaration form stating the work submitted is the student's own work. All digital tasks must be submitted either by a student's school email account (@education.nsw.gov.au) OR by the school moodle on the due date. A signed declaration form must still be submitted on the due date.

If you hand in work after the due date, you will lose 20% per day for 3 days. After that, you will receive zero marks. A mark will be awarded to a piece of work and the penalty will be applied to that mark.

You will receive zero marks for:

- copying another student's work
- plagiarism if you cut and paste without acknowledging the source
- non-serious submission of a task.

For late submission, or where you are given zero marks, a warning letter will be sent.

In all assessment tasks, tests and examinations, a student must:

- follow the supervisor's instructions and behave in a polite and courteous manner towards the supervisors and other students
- be honest and ethical in completing the task
- make a genuine attempt at all parts of the task.

If a student does not comply with these rules, they may be excluded from the assessment and will be awarded zero marks.

To help students and parents, assessment tasks and assistance for their completion will be available on the school's website.

SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COURSE

You will have satisfactorily completed a course if, in the principal's view, you have:

- a. followed the course developed or endorsed by the Board of Studies; and
- b. applied yourself with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school; and
- c. achieved some or all of the course outcomes.

Your attendance pattern must be satisfactory. All students are expected to have a minimum 90% attendance rate. If in-attendance is impacting on your learning and your ability to satisfactorily complete a course, you may jeopardise your results.

Any student in danger of not satisfying a course will receive a warning letter. These may be sent in Year 9 or Year 10. Students who have received at least two written warnings may be regarded as not having satisfactorily completed the requirements of the course. The principal may then apply the N determination. If an 'N' determination is given for a core subject, you will not receive a RoSA.

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU ARE UNABLE TO MEET THE DUE DATE

If you know of a circumstance that will impact on your ability to submit a task on the due date or attend an in-class task, test or examination, you must request an *Assessment Task Illness/Misadventure and Extension Form* from the Head Teacher Assessment (see form in the back of this booklet).

The application form must:

- be submitted prior to the due date and with reasonable notice, and
- give a valid reason for the request, and
- have appropriate supporting documentation attached,
- and include evidence of communication with the subject teacher.

The success or otherwise of your application will be communicated to the teacher, head teacher and student by email. Please note that submission of an application DOES NOT automatically mean that application is successful.

UNEXPECTED ILLNESS OR EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES

In case of unexpected illness or exceptional circumstances, the submission of a task on the due date is the student's responsibility. If for some reason a student is unable to attend school on the day a task is due, they must make arrangements for someone else to hand the task in for them (eg. sibling, parent, neighbour etc.) on the due date. If this is not possible, you must contact the school as soon as possible. As *Assessment Task Illness/Misadventure and Extension Form* may be started with the Head Teacher Assessment. The form must be accompanied by evidence (such as a medical certificate or police report). Arrangements will be made with you and your parents/carers to fulfil assessment requirements as soon as possible after your return to school.
