PRESENTATION DAY 2021

Presentation Day will take on a new look this year because of current COVID restrictions. We are planning to celebrate our students' achievements in three staged assemblies on Tuesday 7 December.

Year 7 and 8 - 9.00 am Year 9 and 10 - 10.00 am Year 11 and 12 - 11.30 am

All students who are receiving an award will be notified by the beginning of week 9, Monday 29 November. Students receiving an award will need to ensure they are in full formal school uniform for the presentation assembly.

As part of this year's celebration, photos of all award recipients will be used to create a multimedia presentation of each stage assembly. These will be posted on the school's Facebook page for all to enjoy.

Unfortunately, parents are unable to attend. However, if department restrictions change prior to the 7 December to allow visitors in the school, we will be able to invite parents. Parents will be notified if this is the case.

The Awards

Under the house points system, students will be awarded points for academic performance, sport and contribution to school community. Students have been tracked all year and given points for their contribution over all three areas. At the end of each presentation, the Special Awards will be presented. The house shields and cup will be presented at the Stage 6 Presentation Assembly.

Academic Awards

The award for Academic Excellence will be given to the student in each year level that is placed first, second or third in the most courses. Any student who is placed first in a course will receive an Award of Achievement. Academic certificates will be awarded to students in all years that are placed first, second or third in three or more courses.

Sport Awards

Individual students will be recognised for their performance in team events.

Students who have represented State and/or Western Region will receive blues. Championship certificates will be presented to swimming, cross country and athletics champions.

The most successful junior and senior boy and girl will also be awarded. These special sports awards are given to the students who score the most points across the three school carnivals and representative honours.

School and Community Awards

Individual students will be recognised for their contribution across many areas of school and community including leadership, public speaking, contribution to band and application to schoolwork.

The student who gains the most points for their contribution to school and community will be awarded the *P&C School and Community trophy*.

Special Awards

In each year, the student who gains the most points for their House will receive the award for Outstanding All Round Achievement. From these six students, the student who gains the most points in the school will be presented with the Student of the Year trophy. All of the major award recipients in each section will receive substantial monetary prizes.

House Awards

Shields will be awarded to the winning house in the three areas of academia, sport and school community. The House Cup will be presented to the champion house. All of these awards will be determined by points scored by each house.

Students *will not* know what awards they are receiving until they are announced. No names will appear on the program, except for the sporting awards where the recipients are already known. After the ceremony, award winners will be given a special souvenir program that will list all the award recipients.

All students who are receiving awards will be notified next week. Award recipients will need to be dressed in full school uniform on the day, this includes black shoes, otherwise they will not be allowed on the stage to accept their award.



White Ribbon Day 2021

Year 7 participated in creating an awareness video and posters for White Ribbon Day which was held last Friday 19 November.

The theme of the video was *we are the battle plan*, as we as a community have the responsibility to contribute to the prevention of violence in relationships.

Students participated in discussions about power in relationships, consent and seeking help. They also created a checklist for positive relationships.

UAC - A Message for Parents of Year 12 students: next steps for uni offers

Congratulations on supporting your Year 12 student through a challenging final year of school! While they're focusing on their exams, stay in the loop on application deadlines and offers with this guide to what's coming up over the next few weeks.

Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS)

Applications for SRS closed on 19 September and the first offers were released today, 12 November. If your child submitted an SRS application and was successful, they would have received an unconditional offer or a conditional offer.

An unconditional offer means that, apart from completing their HSC, they have no further requirements to meet. They can accept it knowing they have a place at uni waiting for them.

A conditional offer means they must meet additional criteria (eg a minimum ATAR). The institution will tell them what these are in the conditional offer email.

If your child receives an unconditional offer to one of their highest preferences but wants to be considered for all other preferences in later offer rounds, they should:

- accept their offer to the course
- move the course down to the bottom of their preference list or remove it entirely.

As long as they have accepted their unconditional offer, they can't lose it.

If they receive a conditional offer, they need to leave the course preference in their UAC application. On 26 January (January Round 2), they'll receive an unconditional offer to the course that is highest in their list of preferences and for which they are eligible and competitive enough. This could be the course for which they received the conditional offer or it could be another course that is higher in their list.

They can only receive one unconditional offer in each round, so they always need to keep the course they most want to study at the top of their list.
