The NSW Government has announced that The Henry Lawson High School has been successful in its application for funding of school infrastructure valued at \$160,000.

The Regional Renewals Program is part of the NSW Government's COVID-19 Recovery Plan in which it is investing \$120 million into regional schools to kick start / increase local economies.

The funding will be applied toward further improvements of our basketball court area, including the erection of fencing around the basketball court, drinking fountains, seating and an electronic signboard.
