Work on the Cooler Classrooms Program is due to commence next term at THLHS, with scheduling and planning already underway.

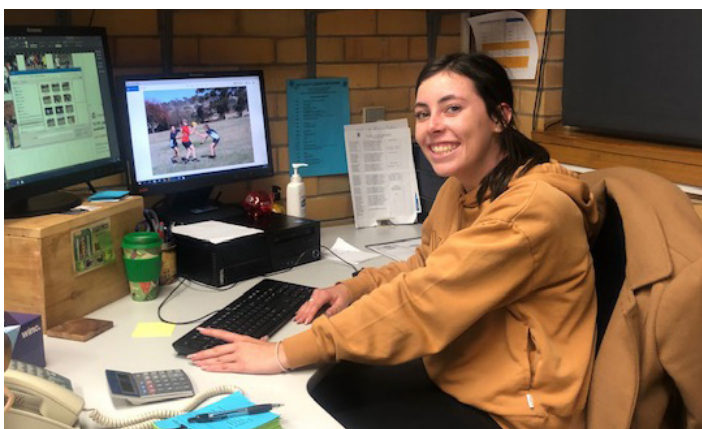
