## **Principal's Report**

Congratulations to all of our presentation day award winners.

The recognition across a full calendar year is well and truly deserved.

It has been a rewarding year for our school. There is no doubt that our school is a great place for learning and growing. It was our first year running the Accelerated Reader program and our first full year with the new school expectations rewards program.

The total number of Accelerator Reader books read in Years 7 and 8 for 2021 is **330**.

2022 does promise to be another fantastic year for our school. We are looking forward to our new Year 9/10 electives:

#### **Big History**

In this subject, students will study the following areas: history of universe, creation stories from different cultures, debunked science theories, history of the Earth, history of us, the future and the death of our sun.

#### International Studies (Henry's Multicultural Food Tour)

Food has the universal power to bring people together. No matter what culture, everywhere in the world, people share and eat together. Food and cooking are a great way to discover and appreciate the richness of multicultural Australia and the world. This elective will provide students with the opportunity to explore the cultures of the world through food.

### **Outdoor Education**

Outdoor education is an opportunity for students to explore the great outdoors. The purpose of this subject is to gain an understanding of the characteristics of wilderness environments and how safely explore the outdoors including exploration skills, environmental awareness and conservation, codes of conduct and safety outdoors, Indigenous land use practices and appreciation of culture and the benefits of outdoor activities for health and wellness.

### Psychology

Psychology provides students with an understanding of the nature of human behaviour. Students develop knowledge and understanding of human nature by asking questions and undertaking studies into the fields of neuroscience, cognitive sciences and social psychology. Students will examine the scientific basis of psychological research as they explore topics, such as memory, consciousness, perception, social psychology, attention, motivation and mental health.

#### **Regional Renewal Grant**

The results of our successful Regional Renewal Grant application should start taking shape in 2022. The approved works will provide a new electronic school sign, fencing for sports courts, cricket nets, water bubblers and new multi-purpose sporting posts for the oval.
