GRENFELL AMATEUR SWIMMING CLUB

Unfortunately, we are unable to begin swimming club this week, but we are hoping that our first club night will be held on Friday 22 October 2021. Please be mindful that this date may change as swimming club cannot commence until the NSW Government allows community sport to go ahead.

Swimming squad, however, is allowed and will begin on Monday 18 October 2021. If your swimmer will be new to squad, please contact Leann at the pool.

Our next meeting has been postponed until Monday 18 October 2021 at 7.30 pm in the club room, in the hope that we will be able to discuss our return to club nights.

Uniform

If any swimmers would like to order new uniform items, club polo shirts, club hoodies, please put your order in with Leann at the pool ASAP. We are anticipating some delays so would like to put an order in very soon.

Development Carnival

Please note that we have had to change the date of our development carnival, which we hope will be held on Sunday 16 January 2022. This will give us some more time to assess the COVID situation and hopefully improve our chances of holding our carnival.

COVID

As with last season there will be some slight differences in the way we operate swimming club, due to the implementation of our COVID-19 safety plan.

Like all other organisations Grenfell Amateur Swimming Club, is required to have a COVID-19 safety plan. At this stage the main points are as follows:

- Everyone in attendance must be **vaccinated**, **signed-in and sanitise before entering the Aquatic Centre**. This includes all parents and spectators, as well as swimmers.
- At this stage there is no limit on the number of spectators that may attend, however, social distancing is to be practised at all times. We would ask that family members sit together.
- The toilet/shower areas have a maximum limit of 17 people. We therefore encourage swimmers to come to the Aquatic Centre fully dressed and ready to swim, pack dry clothes and shower at home at the end of the night. This will help to prevent swimmers congregating in the showers.
- Our usual parent roster will be in place with 6 timekeepers, one person selling raffle tickets and one person
 assisting in the club room. If a timekeeper needs to be replaced during the evening, we are required to sanitise the
 stop watch before it is given to another person.
- The bubblers can only be used to fill water bottles, so we encourage everyone to bring their own water bottle.

Registrations

Registrations are now open. Existing members will be able to log into their *Swim Central* portal and purchase memberships through the *store* (in menu on LHS of screen).

A reminder that *Active Kids* vouchers can be applied for now and can be used to cover the cost of the membership fees.

Please be aware that Swimming NSW has introduced new memberships.

Please make sure that you read these details carefully as there is an important difference between the club swimmer and the full swimmer.

The memberships available within our club are as follows:

- **Dry/Supporter** (previously Non-Swimmer) suitable for committee members, parents and supporters. Fee \$23.00
- Club Swimmer suitable for swimmers who only wish to compete at our club nights and participate at our carnival. This membership is suitable for our 15-25m swimmers (and any other swimmers) who are not looking to swim at outside carnivals. Please note this membership does not allow you to compete at any other carnival other than ours. Fee \$70.00
- Full Swimmer allows you to compete at our club nights and all carnivals across the state. Fee \$93.00

If you are not sure about which registration product is suitable for you, or your swimmer(s), please ask Leann Logan at the pool, Phil Rolls (0439 980 098) or Nicola Mitton (0427 432247).

Please note: Members can upgrade their membership at any time throughout the season and only pay the difference in cost between a membership with greater benefits and their current membership.

School Travel for 2022 2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the **end of term 4.** This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to **transportnsw.info**. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can apply or update details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.
