What's happening in STEM?

Year 7W STEM class have been making towers using different resources.

Using only a limited number of clothes pegs, bulldog clips and paddle-pop sticks, students were tasked with constructing the highest, stable tower. Some interesting designs were developed, with the major problem being stability in the base of the tower. Students worked in groups and collaborated to come up with the best design.

The students' second task was to create a tower that could hold weights. Several groups created towers which held 5.4 kg and even survived a simulated earthquake (ie. Mr Jones shaking the table).

Stage 5 photography and digital media began the year exploring cyanotype printing, allowing students to explore the concept of light sensitive materials. Characterised by their blue colour, these prints are made by exposing prepared paper to sunlight. Objects placed on the paper block the sunlight, creating images.






Year 8 Myth Busters!!

This week in English, Year 8 have been working hard to bust the Greek myth of Theseus and the Minotaur. In the original myth Theseus uses string to navigate his way out of a labyrinth, once he slayed the Minotaur (a monster with the body of a man and the head and tail of a bull). In order to bust the myth students designed their own impressive labyrinths with various twists and turns and then calculated the distance of the labyrinth as well as the weight and length of the string. Finally, students presented their evidence and successfully argued why this myth would be impossible.

Year 8 and 9 are now familiar with the process of Accelerated Reader and the benefits that this program has across their learning KLAs. 

It's all about Chemistry

Year 11 chemistry performed flame tests to investigate the colours emitted when specific metal ion cations are heated. Heating a metal salt causes the electrons in the atom to move to a higher energy level and then drop back to their ground state. This causes a characteristic colour which allows us to identify the metal in the salt.

Last week in Chemistry Year 12 have been looking at titration curves. These were generated by completing a titration and recording the pH on the Vernier Analysis program. The results that they achieved were textbook perfect.
