NAPLAN data is very valuable and useful to teachers and schools to help identify areas for further learning. The tests measure students' literacy and numeracy abilities at a point in time against an objective scale.

UOW Discovery Day

Year 12 are scheduled to attend the University of Wollongong Discovery Day on Wednesday 8 June. This is a fabulous opportunity for students to find out about university life, investigate study options, inspect accommodation and visualise themselves in a university setting.

Notes and money (\$70) are due to the front office. Students will travel to Wollongong on the school bus on Tuesday 7 June, leaving at recess, stay overnight on campus, attend workshops on Wednesday, before returning to school at around 9-9.30pm. Please see Ms McCulloch with any concerns/details.

Work Experience

Year 10 have the opportunity to engage in a week of Work Experience this term from 20-24 June, (week 9). This is a much anticipated week for students, but does require some planning and organisation beforehand.

Work Experience allows students to:

- Prepare for work demands and expectations
- · Make career decisions and possible work options
- Improve student's maturity, confidence and self-reliance
- · Provide a link between students and the working community

The decision about where to go for work experience is a collaborative one between the student and their parent – taking into consideration employment options, transport, work interests. Below are some steps parents can follow to ensure their child is organised.

- 1. Access paperwork in Google Classroom (week 1, year 10 Careers)
- 2. Discuss Work experience options with parents. Consider:
- An engaging workplace
- An inspiring host employer
- A career/work you are interested in
- An opportunity for future full-time or part-time employment
- 3. Once you have a list of option, prioritise list and start contacting.
- 4. Contact employer to ask about availability. If your employer is agreeable to having a student, get the employer to complete the paperwork (pages 2-3).

5. If you need to travel to/from jobs with employer, get them to complete the "vehicle travel with host employer" form. An engaging workplace

6. If you need to be accommodated away from home, get your parent/s to complete the "away from home" form.

7. Finalise the form by getting parents to sign their section (page 4).

8. Sign paperwork yourself (page 1) and return to school for approval (front office)

Year 12 students will have received their UAC PIN on 12 April. The PIN will be sent to the email address NESA has on file for the students. If you have not yet received yours, see your careers teacher.

Students should access StudentsOnline portal to change the pre-filled email address to a personal address (so you can still access after you have left school). This email will have any offers for students and notifications – so it is important!

UAC Guides will arrive shortly, when they do arrive, they contain ALL the information Year 12 need to know about applying for university. Comprehensive course descriptions are available on the UAC website.

To apply through UAC, you need your NESA number (to get your UAC number), your UAC PIN and \$73 (visa, PayPal, BPay).
