Proud and Deadly Award Nominees

Amber Taylor - Outstanding Sport Achievement. Amber represented her school at Western Region in Squash at Coffs Harbour, making it through to selection for the NSW School Squash Championships in Queensland. While at state, Amber was selected to play for the Australian team against New Zealand the following day.

Both Amber and her teammate from school were involved in fundraising to support their trips. Amber has consistently achieved at high levels in her sport over the last two years and persevered despite COVID restricting access to competitions. She has limited access to a cohort of squash players due to being from a small town but makes the most of the local support from the town and accesses competitions in other towns when she is able.

Garrett Smithers - Academic Achievement. Garrett is completing Year 11 at The Henry Lawson High School. He has studied Advanced Maths and Extension 1 Mathematics this year, achieving a high level in both courses. He is keen to take up Extension 2 Mathematics in Year 12. In doing so he joins a very specialised cohort as this subject has only been completed by a very small number of students (5-6) in the past ten years.

Ben Hurst-Strange - TVET/VET Year 12. Ben has successfully completed a Certificate II in Automotive at Young TAFE while completing Year 12 at The Henry Lawson High School. His attendance at TAFE was excellent throughout the duration of the course.

His attitude and commitment to the TAFE course were exemplary: all modules were completed and all competencies met well ahead of schedule.

Ben completed his associated workplacement and received very positive feedback from the employer.

Ben has also supported the ongoing development of cultural awareness through his artwork, working with Aunty Julie Ferguson on the school story poles and the Greater Western Area Health signage project.

Seanna New - TVET/VET Year 12. Seanna New was awarded an Indigenous Scholarship through Western Area Health to study Certificate II (Allied Health Assistant). This is being undertaken as a School Based Traineeship. Seanna attends workplacement one day per week at the Grenfell Hospital while also completing her senior studies at The Henry Lawson High School. Her feedback from her workplacement is very positive. She has shown commitment to online learning which is undertaken through an external provider and competently maintains this as part of her study load.

Seanna demonstrated organisation, initiative, perseverance and independence to ensure the successful establishment of this School Based Traineeship.

Max Harris - Citizenship. Max Harris has demonstrated interest and leadership in developing and sharing his culture at high school. Since beginning in Year 7, Max has commenced school assemblies and gatherings with the Acknowledgement of Country.

He has been doing this in English and is working with our local Aboriginal elder, Uncle Terry, to learn to give the Acknowledgement in Wiradjuri.

Max was part of the original group of students who commenced working with Greater Western Area Health to develop signage in the local health services designed to be culturally welcoming.

Spencer Mehrton - Excellance in Performing/Creative/Visual Arts. Spencer is nominated for his achievement in Stage 5 Photography. He has demonstrated a growing commitment to exploring a different way of viewing the world through the lens of the camera.

Throughout his first year in this course he has demonstrated interest, growth and commitment. He was involved in photographing the Grenfell Show to build a portfolio of shots for the Grenfell Show Society to use in future publications and marketing.

As part of their final week of school, Year 12 presented and planted a tree as their gift to the school.







Year 8 Science

Year 8 science are currently completing a project to practise the scientific method, and to develop their confidence in teamwork and problem solving. They are building parachutes to slow the descent of a rubber stopper, then writing a formal scientific report on their results. It is always great to see the ingenuity of the students – no two designs are the same.





Supreme interbreed ram at Eugowra

Our Border Leicester ram 148 from Weddin Stud at Young exhibited by students from The Henry Lawson High School received Supreme Interbreed Ram. This was first place for 50 exhibits from five studs. The judge commented on the amount of muscling on the ram's carcase and how structurally correct he was. The owner Ned Mullany and the breeder John Niven were very pleased with the interbreed result.

Ella Mitton placed second in the meat sheep junior judging from a field of about 30 competitors. She also was a finalist in the wool and grain judging, placing the wool in the correct order. Brodie Petty was a finalist in the grain and meat sheep finals.

Amber Taylor received reserve champion in the novice cattle paraders and led very well considering this was her first time parading cattle.

Daniel Lutherborrow, Tait Ryan and Tom Whittaker, along with Ella, Amber and Brodie prepared the sheep well and paraded them with skill. They were a very professional team who worked hard and calmly performed their tasks and were a credit to the school.




What's Happening in STEM?

Will has the bamboo planted ready to welcome his pandas.




SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS DRAW

The Jack and Cath Mullane Family Bequest Applications close on Friday 4 November 2022

The Mullane family has established a \$1000 bequest in their names to assist a student who has completed Year 12, in undertaking further study or training.

The Mullane family moved to Grenfell in 1969 with 4 of their 7 children to take up teaching posts at the school. Jack was the Deputy Principal and Cath taught English until 1974.

Jack predeceased Cath, dying in 2017, aged 98. Cath died in 2018 at age 99.

Students who would like to be considered for this scholarship will need to have completed Year 12 at The Henry Lawson High School and have firm plans to undertake further study and training.

Year 12 students received a letter this term from the principal, inviting them to apply for this scholarship, and providing details of how to apply. Additional copies of the letter are available from the front office.

Applications close at 4pm on Friday 4 November 2022. The successful applicant will be announced at our annual presentation day.

SECURING A BRIGHTER FUTURE FOR REGIONAL YOUTH

Eligible students across the Cootamundra electorate are being encouraged to apply for the 2023 Youth Development Scholarships which opened on 5 September 2022 and close on 3 March 2023.

Member for Cootamundra Steph Cooke said this scholarship will provide support to young people and give them a boost to finish their studies.

"I encourage all eligible youth to apply for the \$1000 grant with past scholarship recipients being supported to undertake further studies to become doctors, architects and teachers," Ms Cooke said.

Minister for Families and Communities and Minister for Disability Services Natasha Maclaren-Jones said that doing well in school will open up opportunities for youth.

"From textbooks to internet access, the scholarships will ensure our young people are well-equipped to reach their full potential." Mrs Maclaren-Jones said

The Youth Development Scholarships are open to students studying Years 10 to 12 at high school or TAFE equivalent. Students who received a scholarship previously may be eligible to re-apply.

More than 4700 students have been supported by the scholarship program since it was established in 2017.
