Remembrance Day marks the end of fighting on the Western Front on November 11, 1918.

At the time, the anniversary was known as Armistice Day, in reference to the formal agreement the German leaders signed to end the war.

The name was changed to Remembrance Day after World War II ended in 1945.

Remembrance Day is the time to remember a relative, friend or ancestor, or reflect on the sacrifice of those who have served and died in war.

The minute of silence is held on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

The red poppy has been a symbol of remembrance and hope since World War I.

In the barren, muddy battlefields of Western Europe, the bright red flowers grew in their thousands.

Rosemary is also a symbol of remembrance and has particular significance for Australians as it grows wild on the Gallipoli peninsula.

They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

"Lest we forget".

#### Year 10 Work Experience News

Work Experience is upon us again. The date set aside for Work Experience is as follows:-Monday 5 December – Friday 9 December, 2022 (Week 9)

All students will be out this week to attend, so it is important to get organised early. Below is a checklist to ensure you and your child have fulfilled all requirements.

- 1. Discuss possible interests, strengths, skills with your child.
- 2. Discuss possible contacts and work experience locations that would engage a young person.
- 3. Collect paperwork (from careers) or from SPR form online. https://education.nsw.gov.au/ teaching-and-learning/curriculum/career-learning-and-vet/workplace-learning/guides-andforms
- 4. Read and sign work experience forms.
- 5. Encourage student to contact possible work experience employers to ask about availability.
- 6. If employer is agreeable, send paperwork for employer to sign.
- 7. Collect paperwork from employer.
- 8. Submit paperwork to front office by week 7 (Friday 25 November).
- 9. Ensure student is work ready with the correct attire for the job.
- 10. Ensure student is able to gain daily access to the workplace with transportation.
- 11. If staying with someone else, ensure you complete correct form. (see website above).
- 12. If travelling with the host employer, ensure correct paperwork is completed.

During class in week 8, students will be given their work experience folder. In it will be:

- a. Work experience paperwork (signed) for employer, parent and student.
- b. Letter to employer
- c. Emergency card
- d. Employer feedback sheet
- e. Responsibilities of student
- f. Time sheet
- g. Diary
- h. Guide to workplace learning parents & carers
- i. Guide to workplace learning employers

We encourage parents to make this a positive experience for their child, as this is an important step in students understanding their transition from school to the workplace. Please take time to read the guide for parents and carers, and don't hesitate to contact the school should you need support.
