





### What's Happening in History?

This week in History, Year Eight has been exploring medieval architecture. We began by looking at the key features of medieval manors and what went into making a medieval town, including using water mills for grinding flour and the lords' castle. Students then designed their own manor systems, looking at how they would structure their spaces and support the people of their manor. Students then used Google Earth to look at some of the key features of medieval architecture. We explored medieval wonders such as the moorish palace of Alhambra, the tidal island and monastery of Mont Saint Michel and the impressive stained-glass windows at York Minster.


