

The Henry Lawson High School is committed to providing educational advantage with diverse opportunities for every student. It is important that every student has equity and opportunity and can achieve the best possible outcomes with no barriers.

Your family Statement of Account for 2024 is attached. The voluntary school contribution for 2024 is \$60.00 per student.

In 2024 accounts will not be issued for subject contributions.

In 2024 all voluntary contributions will be used to cover the remaining cost of teaching and learning resources.

You may pay your voluntary school contributions by cash or cheque or through our Sentral Parent Portal App.

A family assistance fund is also available for other educational costs such as excursions, extra-curricular activities, school supplies and uniforms. Families experiencing financial hardship can access this by making an appointment with the principal. Confidentiality relating to all matters is assured.
