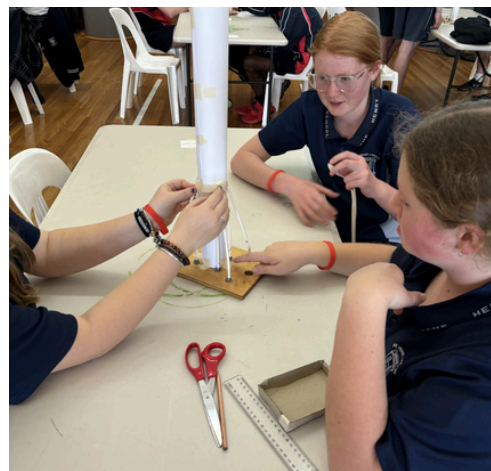
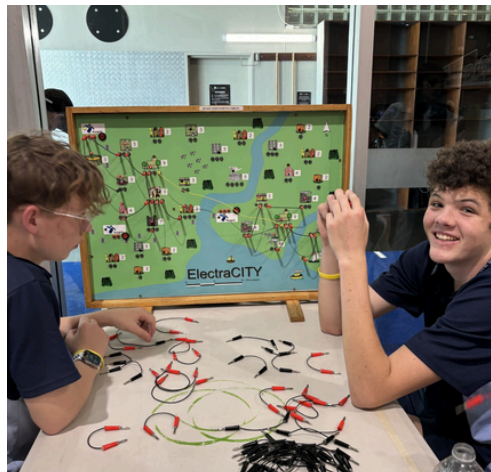
Science and Engineering

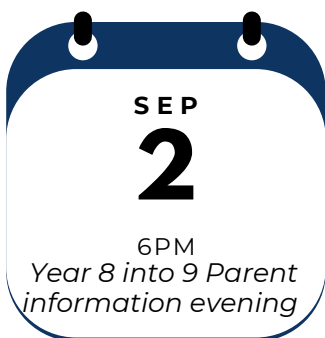

EXPANDED LOW EARTH ORBITING SATELLITE INTERNET SUBSIDY

Improving digital connectivity across Grenfell and the Weddin Shire.

This expanded program now supports Grenfell residents to access internet coverage via the Low Earth Orbiting (LEO) satellite internet network.

The program involves reimbursing eligible Weddin Shire residents for costs incurred when connecting to the LEO satellite internet network. You may be more familiar with this technology by its retail name, Starlink. Program closes 18 October 2024 or when funds are exhausted.
